Major Objectives for use of Rapid DNA in TIP Cases


- Improve investigative outcomes and increase successful prosecution
- Reduce secondary victimization and unnecessary victim trauma
- Introduce new forensic science applications and advances at the local level, building local capacity
- Secure input and explore collaboration

GLOBAL FINDINGS

In 2016, we estimate that 45.8 million people are in some form of modern slavery in 167 countries

This estimate draws on data from random sample, nationally representative surveys conducted by Gallup.






Swab - Exterior Condom

Rapid DNA Results from Case Study Sites

- Excellent results on known buccal swabs from victims
 - No real difference with victim's taking their own samples
- Partial and Full (less frequently) results from swabs taken from:
 - Water and soda bottles
 - Shot and wine glasses
 - Straws
 - Cigarette butts
- Ability to obtain profiles from separate swabs taken from inside and outsides of used condoms


Border Monitoring for Human Trafficking and Human Rights Victims

(CNN) — The U.N.'s refugee agency reports that the number of displaced people is at its highest ever -- surpassing even post-World War II numbers, when the world was struggling to come to terms with the most devastating event in history.

The total at the end of 2015 reached 65.3 million -- or one out of every 113 people on Earth, according to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR). The number represents a 5.8 million increase on the year before.

A little under 1% of the earth's population is either "an asylum-seeker, internally displaced or a refugee" according to the UNHCR report, which was released Monday.




A biometric identity checking firm has found that most people are unable to spot forged passports in a new study.

Identity confirmation service HooYu cited a new study conducted by Atomik research,

in which a sample of 1,013 people were asked to identify if a passport was a real document or a fake. The results showed that 68% of the time people are unable to correctly identify a fake passport.

The report was based on a source of 'moderate confidence', suggesting that ISIS's printing of passports is in no way confirmed.

Next Generation Identification (NGI)


Identification and Investigative Services

The NGI system, developed over multiple years, is an incremental replacement of the Integrated Automated Fingerprint Identification System (IAFIS) that provides new functionality and improves existing capabilities.

EDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

The FBI's Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division operated and maintained IAFIS, which became the world's largest person-centric biometric database when it was implemented in July 1999. Since then, advancements in technology and the changing business needs of IAFIS's customers necessitated the next generation of identification services. To further advance biometric identification services, the CJIS Division, with guidance from the user community, established the vision for the Next Generation Identification.





This technological upgrade accommodates increased information processing and sharing demands from local, state, tribal, federal, and international agencies. The NGI system offers state-of-the-art biometric identification services and compiles core capabilities that serve as the platform for multimodal functionality.

Advanced Fingerprint Identification Technology (AFIT)

AFIT, deployed on February 25, 2011, enhances fingerprint and latent processing services, increases the accuracy and daily fingerprint processing capacity, and improves system availability. This deployment implemented a new fingerprint matching algorithm which has improved matching accuracy from approximately 92% to over 99.6%. This improvement resulted in over 900 additional matches during the 5day parallel operations period immediately after deployment. Additionally, the improved accuracy resulted in a 90% reduction in the number of manual fingerprint reviews required by our service providers.








Human Rights implications

- Human rights applicable to migrants.
- Right to privacy and data protection.
- Principle of non-discrimination.
- Freedom of movement.

"No one shall be subjected to arbitrary interference with his privacy, family, home or correspondence, nor to attacks upon his honour and reputation. Everyone has the right to the protection of the law against such interference or attacks." (UDHR, Art. 12)

- Universal right: The right to privacy is not restricted to nationals of a country, nor is there a distinction between non-nationals in regular or irregular situation.
- Data protection: Everyone has the right to privacy, this includes the right to have personal data protected against potentially intrusive data processing practices and unauthorized disclosure.




Afghanistan as a Country of Transit

There are very few instances in which Afghanistan was used as a country of transit


Known instances predominately involve the transportation of people from Iran through Afghanistan and into Pakistan



Transit Routes








